- Teva or similar water sandals/shoes for wet landings:

- Comfortable closed-toed walking shoes, like sneakers or lightweight hiking boots:

- Sun protection: waterproof sunscreen (SPF 30 minimum) & lip balm:

  - SPF 25 Lip Balm
- UPF-rated, sun-protective hat:
  - Adjustable Air Mesh Hat Men & Ladies
  - Tilley Hat Men & Ladies
  - Ladies Sport Hat
  - Sun Tripper Hat for everyone
  - Sun Runner Hat Kids

- Sunglasses:
  - Econo Everest Glasses
  - Sunglasses by SMITH Polarized with Interchangeable Lenses
- Binoculars compact, waterproof, rubber-armored are best:
  - Amphibian H2O Waterproof 10 x 25 Binoculars
- Insect repellent:
  - Ben's DEET 30
- Small flashlight or headlamp:

- Antibacterial lotion:

- Prescription medicines (an adequate supply to last your entire journey), and written copies of your prescriptions from your doctor. While it may be possible to refill prescriptions during your journey, the availability of refills cannot be guaranteed. What's more, refilling prescriptions in foreign countries can be difficult and time-consuming.

- Camera, lenses, and plenty of film and/or memory cards, and extra batteries
